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Still life composition photography

Dead photographs show inanimate objects such as food, flowers, shells, bottles, glasses, books, jewels captured in the studio or sometimes in the field. One of the traditional forms of art, painting of dead nature was practiced by ancient Egyptians as a way to provide a symbolic send-off for the dead. This use of symbolic and religious objects as part of the compositions of dead nature continued through the Renaissance, after which the form of art became a more secular play ground for artists who could control entire compositions. This was not possible when creating an art from bigger or more animated, subject. In fact, most levels still are close-up; Once a photo has a person in it, it probably can no longer be considered a life again, both on the ground of animation and scale. Focus your still life Composition around a hero object first of all decide which one is your hero object. Ggior Part of the time, the feeling of having the complete chaos instead of a harmonious composition comes not to know which object is the hero. Instead of focusing on an object, the viewer does not know where to look. I always start organizing my life composition still from the center of interest this does not mean that your primary object should be at the center of an image. But you should bring the eye of the viewer to it. Place diagonal objects like spoons or straws for your hero. Make it the most brilliant and sharp object in the frame. For example, in this image, it is clear that the apple is the hero. Because? Its bright color immediately captures your attention. If you're wondering if your center of interest works correctly, apply this simple test: away from the scene. It has up to ten. And turn quickly. What object did you see before? Is your hero? Yes? Good! No? Replace that thing with something less captivating. Do not remove all bright details, bay. Just pay attention to their relative dimension. The small red berries on a dark background is a beautiful visual accent. But a big red dot of a blurred napkin right behind a pink cake is a distraction. The focal point or the center of interest is the brighter in the whole frame 7. Create frames to compose multiple subjects Sometimes there are too many objects to decide which is the focal point. We wouldn't have any idea how deep the scene is. And we would have a little more difficulty recognizing the main object. Of course, it would still be a matter of half a second, but it counts. Every viewer notices things like that unconsciously. And you inform their decision if they like the photo or not. Set some objects and andthem with other scene objects without blocking them completely. Put some atmospheric details in the foreground and add some to a background. What is the main object in the image below? You should be able to say almost immediately that cakes are the main items. This is because the slices are overlapping the other props. Make your viewers feel like I'm working in a three-dimensional scene. Let your objects cast shadows and reflections on each other. Let them interact. In this way, you can create depth in your images and give your photo an illusion of that missing third dimension. Remember that the visual edges of your objects should not simply touch other objects. It should be a clear overlap or clear separation. If you have two cups with free space between them, this is the fine. But if you have two cups and their handles touch slightly, it is confused. Move them closer or pull them over. 4. Use simple shapes as a template Try to organize your composition around a simple form like a triangle or a circle. This will allow you to balance a group of small objects together or invent a harmonious photo in a lack of time. Triangles The classic example (and my favorite) is a triangle. First of all, image mentally a triangle with a base at the bottom of the frame. And then place your objects within its borders. Most of the time, this structure has a hidden feeling of movement. It is not as stable as a square but still has a strong foundation. For this reason, a composition based on a triangle seems balanced, but not boring. Classical triangular composition at work If you want to create a feeling of something that goes wrong, of imbalance or confusion, an inverted triangle is your best friend. I use it mainly in my photos of frustrated writers who deal with creative block, who are ready to burn every single page of the unsatisfactory work. The inverted triangle is much more unbalanced and dynamic I put something massive in the upper part of my frame (like a typewriter or a curve of a question mark). Then I add smaller objects just below it, creating the upper part of an inverted triangle. I love how it looks in the dead nature where you can see a character, say, even a curved writer, we can count curves as basic forms in this context. For example, an S-shaped curve can give the composition a smooth, simple and elegant sense of movement. You can use the S-shaped curve not only in flat lays curves transformed by diagonal lines also work great. Imagine a line that passes, for example, to the left at the bottom corner of your image to the right at the top. You can base your composition on thiso make it dynamic, with a strong sense of movement. You can soften that effect by turning this straight diagonal line into a curve. Images based on curves transformed by a diagonal line Imagine that the curve and place the objects next, following its movement. There is no need to be too precise; Follow the general direction. Allow yourself to put extra details extraOutside the curve to make your composition natural. 3. Use balance and symmetry to draw the viewer's eye this is my favorite composition exercise! Imagine your photo on a playground. Alternatively, if the most visually massive object is right in the center, the seesaw is stable. In other words, you have a balanced composition. But in this way it can be too symmetrical and a little boring. Try placing your main object slightly off the center. This disturbs the balance, so it is necessary to add something to the other end of a swing. Do not add an object of the same dimension (it would lead to another symmetrical composition). Add a smaller object, but put it in addition to the center. You will work as a suitable counterweight. For example, in this still life trapped atar, I have a large bottle of a laboratory with a shining star inside. I placed it slightly off downtown but added two brilliant stars on the left side of a frame. As a result, the brightness of those stars helps create a balanced composition. The Sesavia is still. 2. Photograph the details to bring your composition to life often the problem with the composition derives from a lack of credible details. Images may seem too clean and too orderly. Details bring life to your photo. Some crumbs from the cake, a bit of scattered sugar or a pair of crumpled paper balls. These details show that someone lives in your image. This type of a messy dead life would seem empty without pencil shavings and paper balls now, imagine this tired writer table without pencil shavings. Or the almost symmetrical hopscotch game almost symmetrical without mint leaves taken. It doesn't look really credible, right? And this shot would be too cold and mechanical without scattered coffee, sugar and mint leaves. It's like a house without plants or cozy pillows. You can still live in it, but it could be much more comfortable. But be careful! Do not obscure the point of your photo with secondary details. 1. Cutout to make your images of still life more realistic as an aspiring photographer, I had a big problem with the composition. Undecided cutout. For some reason, I wanted all my items inside the chassis. Intact. No cut. If I had a spoon, the whole spoon was in my chassis. And I don't understand how unnatural it was. In my first few days, I would not have cropped any of the documents or coffee mugs that your spectator feels there is a world outside the frame, which the scene expands laterally and externally. Leaving some minor items outside the frame makes your scene natural. Like you met him in real life and you just released the shutter. And after that keep only half of all objects intact. Keep key details and let other objects be in your photo only partially. Take at least 10 photos with this attitude, and you will find that you can do it easily and freely next time. Only this simple upgrade will bring life to your shot. Conclusion The composition is very similar to learning how to ride a bike. For a long time, it's nothing but failure. And suddenly - voila! You're doing it instinctively.
